**REFLECTION:**

Today's first reading records a very significant moment on the journey of the Israelites through the wilderness to the promised land. Early one morning Moses ascended a mist laden mountain, and there, on the mountain, he came into the presence of God. The God Moses met on the mountain was a God of tenderness and compassion, slow to anger and rich in kindness and fidelity. This was so different to the God's of other religions at that time, that were seen by the people as tyrants' to be placated, even with Human sacrifice. In those religions everything was done to appease the Gods, to keep them happy. Another thing that the Israelites experienced on their long journey through the wilderness, was that God was journeying with them. " Let my Lord come with us," Moses pleads. On our Journey through life, we too can experience a Presence that defies definition walking with us, a Presence that is benevolent and warm. We can experience the God of tenderness and compassion journeying with us. I remember once driving on my own from the west coast to the east coast of the United States, travelling through areas I had never been before. Reflecting on that trip afterwards, I realised that strangely I never felt alone. On reflection, I became aware of a benevolent every step of the way. I hope you may have had or will have similar experience at some stage in your life, so that together we can exclaim: Glory be to the Father, and to the Son and the Holy Spirit. Amen

With the beginning of ordinary time we see a day devoted to the wonder of God.
