### HISTORY AND HERITAGE



On Friday 16<sup>th</sup> May, tour guides from Sts Peter & Paul's Old Cathedral hosted a "History & Heritage" afternoon. This event brought together around 30 participants from various interest groups around Goulburn - including the Mayor of Goulburn Mulwaree and five Councillors, representatives from the Goulburn Heritage Group, the Goulburn Chamber of Commerce and the Goulburn Visitor Information Centre.

Following an informative guided tour of the Old Cathedral, participants were treated to an organ recital by Mr Glenn Amer. The tour then continued to the Crypt, a visit to the famous "School Strike" toilet block, and a behind-thescenes look at some of the fascinating treasures and memorabilia housed in the Archbishop's previous residence, including a display of historic vestments.

Fr Michael Lim, addressing the group, highlighted the importance of Sts Peter & Paul's heritage to the wider heritage of Goulburn, and how the various groups can work together for mutual benefit, especially in this Year of Hope.

Following a Reflection Day on Thursday 19th June, our children received their First Holy Communion during Mass on the weekend of 21st and 22nd June - the Feast of Corpus Christi.

# BISHOP TONY PERCY

Parishioners of Sts Peter & Paul's were delighted to learn that their previous parish priest, Fr Tony Percy, was named auxiliary bishop of Sydney earlier this year.

Anthony Gerard Percy was born in 1963, one of seven children. After completing undergraduate studies, Bishop Tony entered St Patrick's Seminary Manly in the 1980s, being ordained a priest by Archbishop Francis Carroll in 1990.

Following studies in Rome for a Doctorate in Sacred Theology, Bishop Tony returned to Australia, where he was appointed Parish Priest of Goulburn. This began Bishop Tony's passionate enthusiasm for the restoration of our beautiful Old Cathedral - an enthusiasm that still burns brightly for him. His effervescent energy for Sts Peter & Paul's has been a significant factor in our fundraising efforts.

Bishop Tony's episcopal ordination was on 2<sup>nd</sup> May 2025 at St Mary's Cathedral Sydney. The ceremony was well represented by members of our parish, to celebrate the recognition of "one of our own".

#### TEMPORARY BELL INSTALLATION AT STS PETER & PAUL'S




Over the ANZAC Day long weekend in late April, the City of Goulburn hosted the annual festival for the Australia and New Zealand Association of Bellringers (ANZAB). Over 70 ringers from around Australia and New Zealand attended the event.

Church bellringing is a unique musical tradition dating back to the 17<sup>th</sup> century, and is practised around the world. As well as ringing out on Sundays and feast days, bells are rung to commemorate significant occasions, both individual and communal. In a way, bells provide the backing track for life events, becoming part of the soundscape of our lives.

Sts Peter & Paul's Old Cathedral has a large half-tonne Irish bell mounted in the church tower, which rings the Angelus every day. This bell dates from 1869, purchased by Bishop Lanigan.

For the ANZAB ringing festival, this was augmented by a portable installation of eight bells, called a "mini-ring". This was erected between Sts Peter & Paul's Old Cathedral and St Brigid's. Parishioners and other passers-by had the opportunity to try out bellringing for the first time, under the tutelage of experienced ringers.
